P 6766 Virtual Meeting

RESOLVED: that in view of the COVID-19 lockdown period, the meeting of the Planning and Development Committee be held virtually.

RESOLVED: Noted that all Members were present.

P 6768 Disclosable Pecuniary Interests and Non-Pecuniary Interests

Cllr Saunders declared a Non-Pecuniary interest in application number **20/00696/CON** as his wife is the Chair of Governors at the School and numbers **20/00692/S73** and **20/00631/HHOLD** as he is a member of the Acres Residents Association.

Cllr George declared a Non-Pecuniary interest in application number  $\frac{20/00696/CON}{20/00709/F}$  as the Chair of Governors at the School is known to him and number  $\frac{20/00709/F}{20/00709/F}$  as the applicant is known to him.

No other declarations were received.

**Public Forum** 

P6769 'The Meadway', Horley - Pavements

A resident attended the Public Forum to raise the issue of the current poor state of the pavement surfaces in 'The Meadway', Horley. He expressed concern that even though residents had reported the issue to Surrey County Council several times, no remedial action had been taken to date. He was especially concerned that at the present time some residents, many of whom were elderly, had no option but to use the pavements to take their exercise during the COVID-19 lockdown and this was considered to be a serious safety risk.

The Chairman explained the objectives of the Horley Pavement Audit Committee (HPAC) and how they were working together with SCC Councillors and SCC Highways to achieve some reasonably quick fixes by identifying a shortlist of priorities at a time. He thanked the resident for bringing the matter to the attention of HTC and said that HPAC would add 'The Meadway' to their list of priorities.

#### P 6769)

The Town Clerk added that divisional members for Horley were supportive of the work being undertaken by HPAC and together they were trying to address these issues to address accessibility as quickly as possible. The Town Council would pass on the reference numbers supplied by the resident and hoped that the matter would be expedited.

RESOLVED: noted.

#### P 6770 Planning Application: 20/00709/F - St Georges House, 6 Yattendon Road, Horley

The Town Clerk read out a letter from the developer of St Georges House (on the current planning list for consideration) as he was unable to attend the Public Forum. The proposed development was for five flats and a pair of two semi-detached houses. It was highlighted that this was a new application for an additional flat in the roof space of the new building and that Members were welcome to view the site from the road, during the consultation stage. It was further noted that HTC had raised no objections to the previous Planning Application (19/00826/S73).

#### P 6761 - Mole Valley Draft Local Plan Consultation

The Town Clerk reported that the Council had received copies of the responses to the Consultation by RBBC and SASPC which had been circulated to Members for information. These were similar to the response submitted by HTC in that while they appreciated the need for housing, they expressed concern on the proposed allocation of sites at Hookwood due to the apparent lack of adequate provision for medical, educational and transport infrastructure which could impact on Horley services in close proximity. There was also concern about increased congestion in view of growth plans at Gatwick Airport.

RESOLVED: Noted.

#### **Outside Bodies and Sub-Committees**

#### P 6773 Horley Town Management Group (HTMG)

The Town Clerk said that the meeting arranged for 23 March 2020 had not taken place due to the COVID-19 lockdown period.

#### P 6773) Horley High Street Precinct Issues

It was noted that the addition of the large planters and the recycling bins to the precinct had been delayed due to the lockdown period and these were unlikely to be installed by RBBC until later in the year.

Cllr Baker highlighted that UK Power Networks had begun further emergency works and had dug two new trenches at the Victoria Road end of the precinct. He added that the separate reinstatement previously carried out was already beginning to dip. The matter would be followed up with the SCC Streetworks Team, including the concerns raised on the level of the reinstatement works. A further update would be provided at the next Committee meeting.

#### **Additional Town Centre Signage**

The design and positioning of the new Town Centre signage had yet to be agreed with the SCC Highways Area Manager and the HTMG Wayfinding Group.

#### **Ongoing Planning Matters**

#### P 6777 CLP Applications

It had recently come to light that HTC continue to receive some, but not all, the CLP Applications in Horley, received by RBBC. While it was understood that there was no statutory requirement for RBBC to consult HTC on such applications, Members felt strongly that it would be most helpful if HTC could be notified of all CLP Applications received by the Borough Council. It was agreed that the matter would be followed up by the Town Clerk with the Planning Department at RBBC to enquire if CLP Applications could be added to the planning list separately, for noting.

RESOLVED: that the Town Clerk would request that HTC are notified of all CLP Applications in Horley and that these be presented to Members in a separate list for information.

#### P 6778 Horley Conservation Area

The Chairman said it had been brought to his attention that RBBC were drafting a proposal to redraw the boundary of the Conservation Area to exclude Church View Close. Residents had also suggested that Court Lodge Playing Fields should be included in the Conservation Area. He said that it was early days yet, but he wished to flag it up as an ongoing planning matter and would provide a further update once more information becomes available.

RESOLVED: noted.

#### P 6779 Town Centre Regeneration

#### **RBBC Proposed Horley Place Partnership**

The Town Clerk advised members that there was no further progress on proposals for the new Horley Place Partnership put forward by the Borough Cllr, Eddy Humphreys. HTMG and HTC members had pressed for a meeting with all parties to consider the proposed Terms of Reference, to set priorities and to agree a suitable way forward. Since this had not been forthcoming, HTMG members may need to consider continuing in its own right as a separate entity if such agreement could not be reached.

Further progress was currently suspended due to the COVID-19 lockdown period. The issue was ongoing and it was firmly believed that HTMG continued to have an important role to play in plans for the regeneration of Horley. RBBC Councillors for Horley were strongly in support of the HTMG merger with the Horley Regeneration Forum (HRF) and supported the views put forward previously to combine both groups. It was hoped that the matter would be resolved at a later stage and further updates would be provided when they become available.
