STATISTICS AND INFORMATION

The Town Council is administered as a first tier local government authority in an area whose County Authority responsibilities are maintained by Surrey County Council and whose District Council responsibilities are maintained by Reigate & Banstead Borough Council.

There are approximately 22,000 people residing within the boundary of this Council of which 16,225 are registered electors.

The Precept is collected on the Town Council's behalf by Reigate & Banstead Council. For the fiscal year 2008/09, it is set at £278,560. This equates to a sum of approximately £32.59 per band D household. The Precept for the previous fiscal year 2007/08 was set at £269,376.

I have been very honoured to attend a number of functions in the area. It's very good to be able to support our local organisations so well. I have also had many meetings with other groups in the community, which has been very useful for the Council and the other groups as well.

Your local council has continued to provide a good service to the residents of the town through its committees – Leisure & Amenities, Planning & Development and Finance & General Purposes. I hope that the members of the public are pleased with the way our members get involved with the issues in the town.

Since the Town Council elections last year we have 18 members, many of whom are in full-time employment. Their individual attendance records are available for public view, which demonstrate their hard work and commitment to the residents. We have awarded two town awards in 2007 to two residents who have given a lot of their time to the community; we have also been able to awards grants to some worthy groups in the town.

For the first time on the Town Council we have recently held a charity function for my two chosen charities, St Catherine's Hospice and Brambles, which was well supported and a very enjoyable evening. We raised £1,500 to be shared between the two charities.

Looking forward to the future, we are continually upgrading our Corporate Plan in order to give the best possible service to our residents.

I would like to thank the Town Clerk, Alan Jones, for all his help and advice; also the Deputy Town Clerk, Carol Fenton, and the Assistant Town Clerk, Sue Dalley, for all their help and hard work.

Committee Responsibilities

The Committee supervises all financial, administrative and civic matters and ensures that all procedures and financial transactions are dealt with in accordance with the various statutes governing local authority activities. Accounts are checked regularly and two councillors are rostered to conduct an internal audit prior to each F & GP Committee meeting. A number of councillors serve on sub-committees and outside bodies, as described elsewhere in this annual report, which report back to this committee.

Finance

Accounts 2007/08

The Council's accounts are run strictly in accordance with various statutory instruments and guidance received from the National Association of Local Councils. I am pleased to report that all our procedures and internal controls were conducted to the satisfaction of the internal auditor. In the opinion of BDO Stoy Hayward plc, the external auditors, our accounts received complete and unqualified acceptance, and we are fully in accordance with the Audit Commission's requirements. The audited balance sheet for 2006/07 showed an increase in the general reserves from £26,892 to £30,550.

Looking towards the end of the last financial year 2007/2008, the Council accounts remain in a strong state and, it is expected that the general reserves are likely to exceed £30,000 which was forecast when declaring the precept in January. This has been achieved in spite of increased expenditure, for example the costs of the May 2007 local elections, and other costs where the council has little control. The precept is raised from residents of the town, and unlike other higher tier authorities, the Town Council receives no central government grant. However, we are hopeful that other funding can be sought in future years from the Quality Parish Investment Fund, Crime and Disorder Reduction Partnership and Section 106 funding from the Town & Country Planning Act. A most generous bequest was left to us by the late Cyril Edmonds, a local builder, and a full report of the progress made with this will be given by Cllr David Powell at this Town Meeting.

Precept 2008/09

Looking forward to the forthcoming financial year, the Parish element of Council Tax for 2008/2009 has been set at £278,560, which represents an annual increase of 69p per Band D household, an annual increase of 2.16%. The pie chart which follows describes the apportionment of overall expenditure. We have worked hard to achieve best value for the public in the cost of services and facilities provided by the Town Council, and we have ensured that any increase is kept within reasonable levels. It has to be recognised that the council has a responsibility for the continued upkeep of our recreation parks and


community hall, as well as the costs of office relocation and the commitment to provide a quality service to residents.

The Town Council is committed to its programme of enhancements for next year as detailed in its Corporate Plan. These will include improvements to our recreation grounds and the substantive improvements to the Albert Rooms community hall which will be funded by a loan from the Public Works Loan Board. The Town Council has made considerable effort to structure those projects, as outlined in the Plan, on 3 year rolling programmes wherever possible. This has allowed the annual increase to be kept within reasonable levels.

The Town Council will continue to support St Bartholomew's two churchyards and will make a grant of £12,500 towards its grounds maintenance. Charges for facilities such as football pitches) will be increased in line with inflation for the coming year, but we shall freeze any increases of Albert Rooms lettings in view of the likely disruption when building is under way.

Prudent use of Council finances has allowed the Council to use £20,000 of its general reserves towards next year's costs. The Town Council also has a duty to provide for future likely expenditure. The Council is therefore increasing its earmarked funds by £30,000 for football pitches, buildings maintenance and community funds.

The Town Council has considered the need to improve security in its recreation grounds. We are therefore going to increase our budget for CCTV enhancements, which will be carried out in consultation with Surrey Police. There will also be a commitment for regular security patrols in all our parks to ensure the safety of all members of public. The Council has made a provision for floral displays in the town centre in support of our proposed entry into South and South East in Bloom 2008, having successfully achieved a silver award in 2007. Sponsorship from local businesses will also be sought.



Forecast Expenditure 2008/09

Web Site

Businesses and local organisations continue to be added to our local directories on the web with an increased number of hits on the web site, particularly from North America. We also use the web site to accept football pitch bookings and Albert Rooms lettings. We deal with many enquires on our website seeking information about Horley, and interestingly, a

growing number of queries come from potential tourists. In January 2008 the web site received a monthly record of 17,000 visits.

Newsletter

Quarterly issues of our newsletter, Horley Highlights, are produced and delivered to the public using up to 50 distribution points. We have saved printing costs by using our new colour copier for the printing. The 2007 Town Guide was published last year in partnership with our new publishers MAD Ideas, a local Horley publishing company.

Government Initiatives

The Council has fully revised its Freedom of Information Act Publication Scheme, which allows members of the public access to specified council documentation and publications. The Internal Audit committee comprising Cllr Olliver and myself was formed in 2007. In liaison with the clerk, a structured internal audit review programme for 2008/09 has been developed.

Albert Rooms and Town Council Offices

As mentioned earlier, work will commence in mid April to extend and refurbish the Albert Rooms to provide a modern community facility. The Town Council moved from its former offices to the Albert Rooms last year, with the staff using temporary accommodation in a Portakabin in the rear car park. The CAB vacated their offices in June 2007. This will enable the council to create its own council offices with a meeting room.

Acknowledgments

Finally, I must extend my thanks to my Vice-Chairman, Cllr Dr Richard Olliver for his support and to all the committee for their hard work throughout the past year. I also convey my thanks to Alan Jones and Carol Fenton for their administrative support in all matters relating to this Committee. I would also like to thank Sue Dalley for her diligent work as Finance Officer in supporting the councillors' audit sessions.

The Leisure & Amenities Committee also continues to support Horley in Bloom and my thanks go to all the participants and volunteers who make this a successful event. It gave me great pleasure that Horley also received a silver medal for South East in Bloom last year and thanks must go to the participants, Reigate & Banstead Borough Council and the staff at Horley Town Council for making our town a brighter and more cheery place with flowers.

Acknowledgements

First I would like to thank my Vice-Chairman, Cllr Mike George, and all the members of the Committee for their hard work throughout the past year. Many of us were newly appointed councillors following the May 2007 elections. The committee has had to deal with many issues and members have attended many meetings to cope with the growing number of Horley's planning applications. I also thank the Town Clerk for his sound administration and support of this committee.

Committee Responsibilities

Under a statutory consultation arrangement, the Borough Council is obliged to seek Horley Town Council's comments on all applications for development within the parish boundary. The Committee is authorised by the Town Council to address these matters. The Committee also considers planning matters in neighbouring areas deemed to have a significant impact on Horley. These mainly derive from Crawley Borough Council and relate to Gatwick Airport. However, the Council also receives consultations from Surrey County Council and the neighbouring districts of Mole Valley and Tandridge.

Procedures

Applications are listed by the Council staff and circulated weekly to all Councillors. Detailed plans are on file for consultation if required. Following formal consideration comments are submitted regularly to Reigate & Banstead Borough Council. Weekly planning lists for Horley are posted on the website. The Council's comments on planning applications are routinely forwarded to the local press. Over the course of the council year there will have been 14 Planning Committee meetings.

Public Representation

Representations are always encouraged from the public at the Public Forum section of the committee meetings. These have concerned the following applications & issues: Horley North East and North West sectors, Horley Hamlet Residents Group, Limes Avenue Action Group regarding the development of 24 dwellings at 10 -12 Victoria Road, Manorfield School, land to the rear of 12-24 The Drive, Planet Sweet, Farmhouse Public House.

Consultations

The committee has responded to the following consultations:

Gatwick Airport Interim Master Plan SCC Flooding Task Group SCC Rights of Way Improvement Plan for Surrey Planning Reform proposals in Government White Paper Gatwick Express Provision of additional pitches for Gypsies and Travellers in East Surrey RBBC Policy and Procedure Tree Preservation Order

Horley North East and North West Sectors

Particular attention has been given by this committee to these two significant developments. The Horley Master Plan means that two new neighbourhoods will be created at Meath Green and at Langshott which will comprise up to 2,280 new homes, having a massive effect on Horley. Two sub-committees have been formed and have formulated detailed responses to "reserved matters" which are submitted to the Local Planning Authority by the developers. The sub-committees have paid particular emphasis to (i) transport and (ii) infrastructure respectively. We shall continue to monitor these applications most carefully.

Other

Under the committee's terms of reference, the committee has also been actively involved with the following:

Gatwick Airport

As well as our attendance at GATCOM by our representative, Cllr Richard Olliver, at regular meetings, the committee had a useful meeting with the Managing Director, Mr Andy Flower, in November 2007 at the airport where a number of issues were discussed.

Highways

The committee was instrumental in appointing its own independent consultant, Mr Ralph Olesen, to advise on the state of Horley's roads. The report gave a very useful "no holds barred" view of the quality of highways repairs with in depth analysis. It was sent to the Leader of SCC and has since been discussed with Surrey County Council's highways officers and county councillors.

Railway Station

We continue to look into complaints from commuters and bring them to the attention of Southern Railway, the station operator.

Horley Regeneration Forum.

and this

The above forum was formed last year. It has given Horley Town Council a strong voice to produce a sustainable development strategy with all partners as the development in both the town centre and the NE and NW sectors progresses.

Training

The committee is formulating a regular training programme. We have already received a detailed briefing by the Borough's senior planning officer on the North East sector. Next year we intend to invite guest speakers on a variety of topics.

TOWN AWARDS

The Town Awards scheme has been in operation since 2000, with the first awards being presented at the Annual Town Meeting of 10 April 2000. Nominations for Town Awards are invited every year, when any resident of the Town can complete a nomination form, together with a seconder, to propose an individual for outstanding service or commitment to the town. Horley Town Council is responsible for the administration and final selection of award winners according to strict guidelines and criteria.

An Awards Sub Committee reviews and makes its recommendations to the Council. Award winners receive a Town Badge, a Certificate of Commendation, and their Citation. Presentations are usually made either at the Annual Town Meeting, or other appropriate events, subject to the award winners' approval.

In 2007 the Town Council's Awards Committee considered a total of 4 nominations from members of the public. Two residents were invited to accept an award and these were presented at the Horley in Bloom Awards Evening last September.






FULL COUNCIL ATTENDANCE STATISTICS




FINANCE & GENERAL PURPOSES COMMITTEE ATTENDANCE STATISTICS
