

STATISTICS AND INFORMATION



The Town Council is administered as a first tier local government authority in an area whose County Authority responsibilities are maintained by Surrey County Council and whose District Council responsibilities are maintained by Reigate & Banstead Borough Council.

There are over 22,000 people residing within the boundary of this Town Council of which 17,679 are registered electors as at 1 April 2016.

The Precept is collected on the Town Council's behalf by Reigate & Banstead Borough Council. For the fiscal year 2016/17, it is set at £315,882. This equates to a sum of £35.24 per band D household. Please refer to the Finance Chairman's report for more details about the precept.

FINANCE & GENERAL PURPOSES COMMITTEE REPORT



It was a great honour to be elected as the Finance & General Purposes Committee Chairman last May.

Financial Year 2016/17

The Town Council Precept for 2016/2017 has been set at a total net figure of £315,882. This means that the Town element of Council Tax will be an annual amount of £35.24 (less than 68p per week), representing an annual increase of 62p per Band D household (+ 1.79 %). The Town Council is fully committed to maintaining all its services, as well as pursuing a programme of enhancements and new projects. These will include improvements to our recreation grounds and playgrounds, about which more elsewhere in the Annual Report.

The Town Council will continue to review security in its recreation grounds. The CCTV cameras at Horley Recreation Ground have recently been replaced with upgraded models, thanks to funding from the Police & Crime Commissioner's Community Safety Fund. Provision has been made for continued enhancements to CCTV, in consultation with Surrey Police. There will also continue to be a commitment for regular security patrols in all our parks to aid the safety of all members of public.

The Council has also made provision for floral displays to enhance the town centre for the benefit of residents and visitors, in support of our planned entries for South and South East in Bloom 2016, having already won two Silver Gilt awards in 2015.

It is our intention to move ahead in 2016/17 with the replacement of our aging skate park. We have already received an award from Surrey County Council's Community Improvements Fund towards the skate park project. We have also formulated bids to several other grant providers for the new skate park, but the project will be funded from our earmarked Reserve funds if those bids prove unsuccessful.





Future services

With the removal of government grants to County and Borough Councils causing gaping holes in annual council budgets, there is a risk that the higher levels of local government may be forced to withdraw some services in order to balance their books in years ahead. If this proves to be the case, Horley Town Council will discuss with residents as to which services they would deem essential. These could potentially be devolved to and managed by the town council, with any costs met through its council tax.

In a challenging financial climate, Horley Town Council is committed to providing and enhancing facilities that meet the communities' needs, and in doing so, achieving them at best value.

Website, Town Guide and eNewsletter

The Town Council's website, revamped just over a year ago, continues to provide the vital information for residents. The latest edition of the Town Guide was released in January 2016 and delivered to all residents via Royal Mail, however copies are still available from the Town Council offices. The Town Guide was funded through the advertising contained therein and provides such key information to residents at no cost to this council. The Council staff also prepare a monthly eNewsletter with both council and local news and events, which goes to over 800 residents and is increasing in popularity every month.



I was very pleased that during this year, two residents undertook the care and improvement of the tiered flower-beds between The Drive and Russells Crescent. This is now looking very nice and I would like to record

PLANNING & DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE REPORT

The Town Council is a legal consultee on all planning applications within the parish boundary and the Planning & Development Committee acts for the Council on these matters.

The Committee also considers any planning matters from neighbouring authorities such as Crawley, Mole Valley and Tandridge Borough and District Councils, which may have an impact on the town and its residents. During the past 12 months, the Committee has considered a total of 296 [261] Planning Applications for Horley. These comprise:

- 9 [11] Consultations from Surrey County Council (SCC) on schools and others from neighbouring authorities such as Crawley (including Gatwick Airport) and Mole Valley;
- 27 [18] large developments of 6 or more dwellings;
- 28 [22] small developments of less than 6 dwellings;
- 175 [143] extensions, loft conversions, conservatories and fencing;
- 36 [47] covering tree preservation orders;
- 21 [20] commercial properties including changes of use for retail units.

The figures from last year are included for comparison purposes.

The Committee is also responsible for the following:-

Gatwick Airport:

Following the Government's decision to delay to this summer the announcement of the location of the new runway, I have nothing further to report on this matter.

Through our on-going membership of the Gatwick Airport Consultative Committee [GATCOM] together with our re-appointment as a GATCOM member of the Noise and Track Monitoring Advisory Group [NATMAG], we are actively engaged in all airport matters as they may affect the local communities.

Highways:

The growth of potholes in our roads continues unabated despite the efforts of the county's highways contractor and the Council encourages residents to report these to us or via Surrey County Council's interactive web site. This also applies to defective street and traffic lights as well as damage to street furniture and road signs. The Council will continue supporting local residents with highways issues. Project Horizon continues with major highways works across the town.

Local Transport:

Our concerns on local transport provision as outlined in my report from last year, I regret to say, remain unresolved. The bus gate allowing buses from the Acres access to Langshott and the passing bays in the lane have yet to be completed or even started.

We continue to press the County and Borough Councils on this matter so that all parts of The Acres development have easy access to the Fastway bus. Should extending the current service through The Acres not be feasible for access reasons we are exploring other options with the ward borough councillors.

The other outstanding issue is the extension of the Fastway 20 service northwards to East Surrey Hospital and Redhill.

Horley Regeneration:

Contrary to expectations, The Acres development was not completed in 2015 with work continuing on the bus gate, community centre and the Riverside Green Chain however the new Baptist Church was completed on time and is already an active community facility both for its members and local groups.

Work has started on the North West Sector with completion of the temporary river crossing and the access road from the A217 where a new roundabout is currently under construction. The fuel pipeline serving Gatwick has been diverted with the redundant section being removed. Phase one show houses are expected to be available for viewing from August this year and the first properties occupied in 2017. We are urging the developers to have the shops and health centre completed as soon as possible in order that a sense of community can start to be built.

I mentioned in my report last year that the Borough Council would be consulting on their Development Management Policy and to that end the Council has submitted its suggestions on suitable areas for redevelopment for residential and employment; we had earlier sent our proposals on areas to be designated as urban open spaces.

Through planning applications and grant funding, the Council is supporting the re-building of Strawson Hall so that it will resume its place as a popular community facility.

Proposed Business Park:

The Council is aware of the views of some of our residents on the proposed business park located at the southern edge of the town. We have, and will continue to have, a dialogue with the Borough Council as this project moves forward, however, the Council will not formulate a response until a planning application has been published to avoid predetermination.

Horley Town Management Group:

The Council continues to work with and supports the efforts of this Group.

Flooding:

This continues to be a major concern to many of our residents across the town particularly in respect of possible impacts to the existing built areas from the North West Sector and the proposed business park. This Council has had several discussions with the developers of the North West Sector on their flood mitigation proposals.

Our determinations on planning applications are available to view on our web site together with our responses to consultations. I am also happy to take telephone calls or e-mails from residents on the workings of the committee and its decisions.

This being the first year of a new administration we have ensured new members of the committee have received internal training also the opportunities to attend external briefings and workshops on planning matters. This will continue for all members with the new Housing and Planning Act which will come into force this year.

In conclusion, I would like to thank my Vice Chairman, Councillor David Jackson, and all members of the Committee for their hard work and support throughout the past year. My thanks, also to Joan Walsh, our planning officer, without whose support our job would be impossible.




